2024 Quilting in the Pines - Quilt Show Definitions

CATEGORIES: Further changes and/or subdivisions of some categories may be made based on technique and size if entry numbers warrant

Junior (under 18)	Two Party Bed Quilt
Group Quilt (more than two creators)	Two Party Lap/Throw/Crib Quilt
First Judged Quilt	Two Party Wall Quilt
Miniature Quilt	One Party Bed Quilt
Art Quilt	One Party Lap/Throw/Crib Quilt
Miscellaneous	One-party Wall Quilt

CATEGORY DEFINITIONS:

Art Quilt - A creative visual work that is layered and stitched. The quilt must be original, not executed in a class, not under educational guidance, not from a kit or commercial pattern and to the best of the artist's knowledge does not violate any copyright laws.

Bed Quilt - Intended for use on a bed: Twin, Double, Queen or King. The total perimeter of the quilt should measure more than 250 inches.

First Judged Quilt - This is the first time the quilter has entered any quilt for judging in any quilt show. This may be a one party or two-party quilt.

Group quilt - Three or more persons were involved in its completion.

Junior Quilt - A quilt made by a quilter under 18 years of age. The Junior may receive assistance with the completion of the quilt.

Lap/Throw/Crib Quilt - A smaller than bed size quilt used as a cover. The total perimeter of the quilt should be between 150 and 250 inches.

Miniature - A quilt completely scaled down in all features from a large pieced, appliqued, or whole cloth quilt design, no larger than 24" on a side and with block size not exceeding 4".

Miscellaneous - Any quilted item not included in another category. Items appropriate for this category could include table and bed runners, quilted clothing, tree skirts, tote bags and mantle scarves.

One-party Quilt - Only one person made the top and did the quilting on the quilt.

Two-party Quilt - Two people were involved in the completion of the quilt.

Wall Quilt - A quilt intended for display on a wall. The total perimeter of the quilt should be less than 250 inches.

TECHNIQUES:

Embroidery - The predominant technique is embroidery by hand, computerized or both.

Pieced - The predominant technique is piecing by hand, machine or both.

Appliqued - The predominant technique is applique by hand, machine or both.

Mixed - A fairly even balance of piecing, applique and/or embroidery with no technique dominating the finished quilt.

Other - One or more special techniques used to develop the design of the top such as whole cloth, cathedral window, hand embroidery, crazy quilting, paint, ink, surface texture from fabric manipulation, etc
